Why Topping Hurts Trees

Topping is perhaps the most harmful tree pruning practice known. Yet, despite more than 25 years of literature and seminars explaining its harmful effects, topping remains a common practice. This brief article will explain why topping is not an acceptable pruning technique.

What is topping?

Topping is the indiscriminate cutting of tree branches to stubs or lateral branches that are not large enough to assume the terminal role. Other names for topping include "heading," "tipping," "hat-racking," and "rounding over."

The most common reason given for topping is to reduce the size of a tree. Home owners often feel that their trees have become too large for their property. People fear that tall trees may pose a hazard. Topping, however, is not a viable method of height reduction and certainly does not reduce the hazard.

Topping will:

1. Make a tree more hazardous in the long term.
2. Stresses trees. Because topping often removes 50 to 100 percent of the leaf-bearing crown of a tree, there are virtually no leaves to produce photosynthesis. Leaves are the food factories of a tree, producing sugar; topping can cause a tree to starve.
3. The defense system is weakened.
4. Leads to Sunburn, as the bark is highly exposed to the sun's rays.
5. Is very ugly.
6. Is quite expensive.

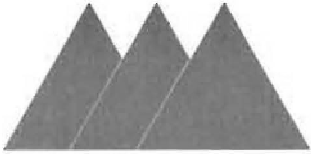
